Ordinary Time - Fifth Sunday after Pentecost - Green

Ordinary Time is a season of the Christian liturgical calendar. The English name is intended to translate the Latin term Tempus per annum (literally "time through the year") Ordinary Time comprises the two periods - one following Epiphany, the other following Pentecost - these times do not fall under the "strong seasons" of Advent, Christmas, Lent or Easter.

The weeks of ordinary time are numbered eg. Second Sunday after Pentecost through to 25th Sunday after Pentecost, and finishing with the Feast of Christ the King.
